Heath Village's expansive community garden provides residents with the opportunity to continue to enjoy one of their favorite hobbies. There are traditional beds as well as several raised plots to accommodate everyone. Fran and her husband Bill were so excited to move in this spring just in time to plant their own garden and see their and all the residents' plots bloom.

Not only does the garden provide exercise and joy for residents, but it also produces an abundance of flowers, fruits, and vegetables. Years ago, the gardeners had a thought...Wouldn't it be great to share our harvest with all the residents. The idea spurred the creation of the Heath Village Farmers Market. Every Friday from the beginning of July to Labor Day, resident gardeners are encouraged to share their bounty with the community. In addition, Ort Farms in Long Valley donates corn and additional produce. There are no set fees, instead shoppers are encouraged to make a donation to the Clarence W. Sickles Friendship Fund.

Several resident volunteers help organize the Market. For the past several years Mary Kashmanian has managed it. She and her team of resident garden volunteers, including Bob Jones who is the Community Garden manager and liaison to Ort Farms, work together to ensure everything runs smoothly.

We look forward to watching our garden continue to grow!














Cardio Splash!
